Each selected Hunt Little Hero will act as "Hero for the day" at a special celebratory event at their local Hunt community in honor of Month of the Military Child. It is Military Child Month

The month of April is Month of the Military Child. To coincide with this Hunt is launching a new program called Hunt Little Heroes. Children between the ages of 4-15 who are dependents of active military service members are eligible to apply to be a "Hunt Little Hero" in their local community. This is open to ALL military children, not just those that live in or near a Hunt Military Community. Children of Hunt employees whose parent(s) are active service members are also eligible to apply. Children can submit their stories of how they are a hero in their community by writing a 300-word essay, drawing a photo, or creating a video. Submissions are due by April 20, 2020.
